**Workshop on writing manuscript for PubMed indexed journal. In this workshop hands on training for the participants was given.**



The Guest Of Honor Ms Radha Saini, Fellow UICC, Geneva, had emphasized on the **writing manuscript for PubMed indexed journal** - The publication of original research in a peer-reviewed and indexed journal is the ultimate and most important step toward the recognition of any scientific work. However, the process starts long before the write-up of a manuscript. The journal in which the author wishes to publish his/her work should be chosen at the time of conceptualization of the scientific work based on the expected readership. The journals do provide information on the “scope of the journal,” which specifies the scientific areas relevant for publication in the journal, and “instructions to authors,” which need to be adhered to while preparing a manuscript. The publication of scientific work has become mandatory for scientists or specialists holding academic affiliations, and it is now desirable even at an undergraduate level. Despite a plethora of forums for presenting the original research work, very little of it ever gets published in a scientific journal, and even if it does, the manuscripts are usually from the same few institutions. It serves the purpose of academic recognition; and certain publications may even contribute to shaping various national policies. An academic appointment, suitable infrastructure, and access to peer-reviewed journals are considered as the facilitators for publishing.

Post lunch the session by Ms Radha Saini, Fellow UICC, Geneva by giving one practical exercise to each faculty.

16-20	>75%	Adequate Knowledge




FIG:1 PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PRETEST AND POSTTEST SCORES

The results are as follows.

Pre-test results: Among the 30 delegates,

- 27 (90%) had inadequate knowledge,
- 3 (10%) had moderately adequate knowledge and

Post-test results: Among the 30 delegates,

- ❖ 23 (71.875%) had inadequate knowledge,
- ❖ 6 (18.75%) had moderately adequate knowledge and
- ❖ 1 (3.125%) had adequate knowledge.
