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
Emerging infections can be caused by:





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




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Quiz was conducted on International health regulations in which Ms .Ansu thomas and MS.Fathima Hussian from II year got the first and second prize respectively.

Table 5 :Distribution of student feedback analysis on emerging and re emerging diseases.





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



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


Fig no. 4: Percentage distribution of feedback analysis among students on Value Added Course related to Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy


OBJECTIVES OF THE VALUE ADDED COURSE









After the post Assessment the feedback were collected from all the participants about the session. 89% students' feedback was Excellent, 8% students' feedback was very good and 3% students' feedback was good



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


