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
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- Community Service Initiatives: Alumni played an instrumental role in organizing health camps and wellness programs, greatly contributing to the institution's outreach and service impact on local communities.



-Competitive Exams: Offered guidance on preparing for competitive exams relevant to public health roles, government nursing positions, and overseas placements.

- Advanced Certifications: Recommended additional certifications, such as those in critical care or emergency nursing, to enhance global employability.

Following this,Mrs. Aruna, Associate proff OBG dept, discussed skill-building for competitive exams. She outlined strategies for students to prepare for exams like AIIMS, ESIC, and state-level nursing tests, emphasizing time management and exam-specific techniques.

Guest Lecture Report for 2021

The Narayana College of Nursing Alumni Association held its **Guest Lecture** on **September 18th, 2021**, with a focus on "Global Nursing Careers and Opportunities in Different Countries." The event gathered alumni, faculty, and students to discuss the various pathways and growth potential available to nurses worldwide.









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OpeningRemarks:

The session began with an address by Chairperson Dr. Vanaja Kumari, who welcomed attendees and introduced the event's theme. President Professor K. Madhavi Latha followed with updates on the association's efforts to support students, including new mentorship initiatives aimed at helping graduates navigate the international nursing landscape.

Global Nursing Career Opportunities

The featured speaker, **Ms. Kalavati**, an RN based in the U.K., delivered an insightful presentation on the diverse career paths available for nurses in different countries. She discussed the qualifications, language requirements, and certifications necessary for nursing in various regions.

United kindom and Canada:

Ms. Kalavathi explained that the U.S. and Canada offer abundant opportunities in specialized fields such as critical care, oncology, and pediatrics. To practice in the U.K., nurses must pass the **NCLEX-RN** exam, while Canadian registration requires the **NCLEX-RN** or **CRNE** (Canadian Registered Nurse Exam). Language proficiency in **English (IELTS or TOEFL)** is essential, and additional certifications (e.g., in emergency or critical care) enhance job prospects.

United Kingdom and Europe:

The U.K. offers rewarding career options in both public and private healthcare sectors. The Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) regulates nursing, and passing their registration process, including the OSCE (Objective Structured Clinical Examination), is essential. European countries increasingly recognize international nursing degrees, and the IELTS or OET (Occupational English Test) is often required for non-EU nurses.

Australia and New Zealand:

These countries are in high demand for qualified nurses, particularly in specialties like mental health, aged care, and perioperative nursing. Nurses need to pass the **OSCE** or demonstrate practical experience, in addition to meeting **English language requirements** (IELTS/OET). Australia and New Zealand have well-defined pathways for skilled migration, making them attractive options.

• Middle East (UAE, Qatar, Saudi Arabia):

The Middle East offers excellent remuneration and tax-free salaries for nurses, with a particular demand in critical care, surgical, and neonatal nursing. Requirements vary, but language proficiency and basic registration exams such as **Prometric** or **HAAD** (**Health Authority-Abu Dhabi**) are standard.

• Asia and Developing Markets:

Countries like Singapore, Japan, and Malaysia offer competitive opportunities as they continue to expand their healthcare sectors. In Japan, for example, nurses can benefit from cultural exchange programs and specialized training initiatives. Language skills and cultural adaptation are crucial for success in these regions.

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Scope of Nursing and Career Advancement

Ms. Kalavathi highlighted that nursing is no longer confined to clinical roles but has expanded into **public health, research, administration, and education.** Nurses can advance into management, policy-making, and even consulting, with opportunities to influence healthcare systems globally. Furthermore, the demand for specialized nurses in areas like geriatrics, mental health, and palliative care is on the rise, offering unique career avenues.

Developing Skills for Global Nursing Standards

Mrs. Aruna, Associate Professor in the OBG Department, focused on skill-building for international standards. She advised students on preparing for competitive exams, optimizing study techniques, and keeping updated on medical advancements. She emphasized that time management and effective study practices are essential for exams such as AIIMS, ESIC, and state-level tests.

Soft Skills for Global Careers in Nursing

Mrs. Anjani, a specialist in Mental Health Nursing, underscored the importance of empathy, cultural sensitivity, and communication skills in nursing. She noted that these qualities are crucial in mental health roles and emphasized that they are essential for nurses working in diverse, multicultural environments.

Treasurer's Insights on Public Health Careers

Treasurer Mrs. Mabjan presented an overview of **public health nursing**, which plays a vital role in preventive healthcare and international health initiatives. Public health nurses are instrumental in addressing community health issues, which are increasingly prioritized worldwide, and she encouraged students to explore this rewarding field.

Introduction

Nair, a Project Assistant with SHARE India, on the critical topic of **Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV) Care and Infection Prevention and Control in Healthcare Settings**. The session aimed to inform and educate nursing students and alumni about the strategic initiatives being implemented in healthcare facilities to address SGBV and enhance infection prevention and control measures.

Overview of Mrs. Arya S. Nair's Work

3. Data Collection and Analysis:

 Conduct on-site assessments using standard tools, ensuring the correct and consistent collection of data, and assist in reporting and analysis.

4. Reporting and Recommendations:

Develop action summary reports with recommendations for healthcare facilities and government bodies, focusing on innovative strategies and approaches.


5. Capacity Building:
